From the Top Down by Mike Thompson



For the April activity we met at Marie Calendar’s, across from the St. Mark’s Hospital on 39th South. The food was tasty, and they took good care of us. Thence we wended our way across the city to the Utah State Capitol. Worried about downtown traffic, many of us drove 7th East to “I” Street, then up to 11th Avenue. From 11th and “B,” Bonneville Blvd (I didn’t know that was the name) loops around Memory Grove, past the mouth of City Creek Canyon.

My grandparents lived on “H” Street between 7th and 8th Avenue, and occasionally spent time in the Canyon. Because of pollution and destruction to the watershed, from human “beans,” the canyon was closed 1952 - 1966. After it re-opened, our family would gather there to picnic on the 4th of July. The canyon road is narrow, with a posted limit of 15 mph. It might take 15 minutes to drive the 3 miles to the water treatment plant. From there it is another 2 miles and 10 – 15 minutes to Rotary Park, the picnic area. At least that’s the way it used to be. I have not been in the canyon since university days. It wouldn’t be a sporty road for the Miata. But I hope to drive the canyon again, some day.

Salt Lake City annexed the entire canyon in 1985, and designated it a Nature Preserve and Protected Watershed. A complete re-build of the treatment

plant closed the canyon to private vehicles in November 2023. Bicycles and pedestrians can enter on weekends and holidays only. If all goes well, the canyon will re-open in January 2-027.

The cherry blossoms were in beautiful, full bloom at the capitol. The exhibit celebrating 100 years of movie making in Utah was fascinating. A few of the easy ones: Robert Redford roaming the wilds on the backside of Timpanogos (Jeremiah Johnson); Zion National Park as backdrop for Redford and Newman (Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid); Young Indiana Jones (River Phoenix) scouting for artifacts near Moab (Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade); Charlton Heston (plus 2) returning from a time warp, splashing down in Lake Powell (Planet of the Apes); Will Smith dragging a knocked-out alien across the Salt Flats (Independence Day)... There have been so many movies. A visit to the exhibit is worth your while any time. It is open through October I think. As we leave winter behind there are many great activities to come. It’s top down time! Mike

The club's annual business meeting will be held Saturday 20 July 2024 in the pavilion behind the church located at 6410 S 725 E, Murray UT 84107. The meeting begins at 2PM, with food at 4PM. Please see details elsewhere in this issue.

This year we will have the opportunity to conduct very unusual business. The Utah Miata Club was first organized in 1991. That's 33 years of great activities. In the course of events the club was legally incorporated, for good and sufficient reasons. However, as the years passed by, the club's status lapsed. The corporation was dissolved by the state, without a decision or vote by the members. In the eyes of the law, the Utah Miata Club is no longer a thing.

Those good and sufficient reasons that led the club to incorporate in the beginning still exist. Consequently the Officers and Board of Directors of the Utah Miata Club will bring the matter before the members for a vote during the annual meeting. **Should the Utah Miata Club register and incorporate as a nonprofit entity in the state of Utah, followed by obtaining status as a 501(c)(7) tax-exempt social club under the Internal Revenue Code?** There will be plenty of time for discussion and answering questions, before the vote is taken. To participate, you will need to be present.

We will use the legal event of incorporating the club as an opportunity to update our bylaws. The proposed new bylaws will be made available to all members not later than early June. You will have opportunity to offer your improvements to what is being proposed.

This event is not a power play. Incorporation offers distinct legal protections to the members, Officers and Board of Directors of the Utah Miata Club. The club has always been and remains a group of friends who like to get together, enjoy good company, and drive our Miatas. It is important that you be present and vote. Please watch for additional news, and plan to attend the annual meeting.

This awesome club has been around for 30+ years and continues to be a great resource for Miata owners that enjoy seeing our great country top down. I would bet Roger has some fun stories about the early days with the Utah Miata Club and some of the events they had back then.

Read his great story below:

My Miata is a 2020 RF, Soul Red. No personal plates. Yet....

In the summer of 1992, I came home from work to find a new shiny red Miata in the driveway. The wife had been busy that day. A few weeks later we were followed home by some neighbors in their Miata who introduced us to the Miata Club. We joined shortly after and in the next ten-ish years enjoyed traveling with the club and seeing more of the State than either of us had ever seen. I had first heard about the club from Jim Bowers while we were working at Dugway Proving Ground.



I was born in Boise but moved to Portland when I was eight years old.

I lived in France for three years courtesy of the U.S. Air Force. A year after returning home I moved to Salt Lake for a job. That was in 1965. I thought it would be for just a few years but I'm still here.

I met my wife in Salt Lake City. A neighbor lady I knew came to visit one day and brought a friend of hers named Janet. We got married in 1970 and enjoyed 51 years together. I inherited two little boys with the marriage and added another boy and then a girl.... I'm still wondering what the heck happened! My Janet passed away in 2021.

Apparently, part of the grieving process is buying things for yourself. I got carried away and bought a Miata from Bountiful Mazda. As one of the perks, they paid a year's dues for the Miata Club; so here I am once again.

I have always enjoyed the outdoors and I would ski quite a bit when I was younger, and it was cheaper. My real interest over the years was riding my motorcycle, a Yamaha V-Star 1300. Janet liked to go on the shorter rides with me and especially enjoyed the rides up the canyons. Two of my boys had their own motorcycles and often went on the rides with me...and that was always fun. I would mostly wander aimlessly through Utah's beautiful landscapes enjoying the view. My kids (mostly my daughter) encouraged my Miata purchase thinking I might be a bit old for two wheels.

May Miata Club Drive / Car Show in Elberta, Utah

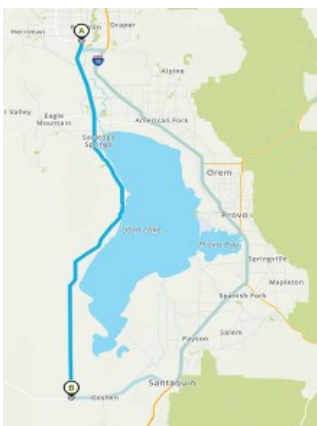


**Date: Saturday, May 11th; Meet: 9:30 a.m.

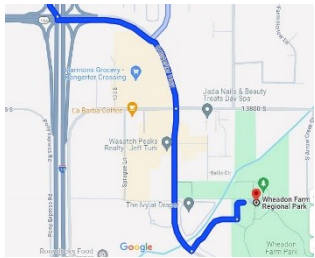
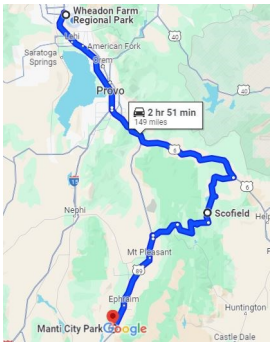
23RD ANNUAL ED "BIG DADDY" ROTH'S RAT FINK REUNION

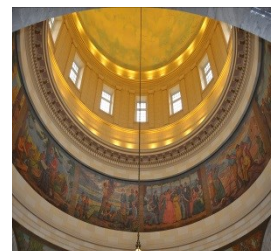
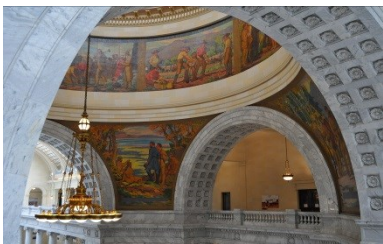
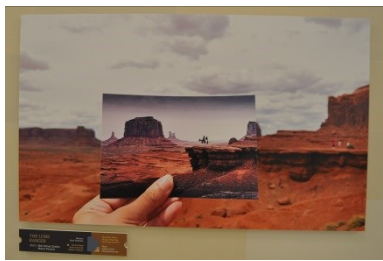
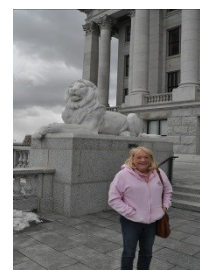
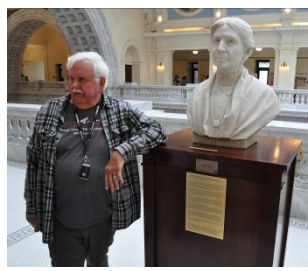


Report on Utah Film, TV & Photography Exhibit by Mike Bailey

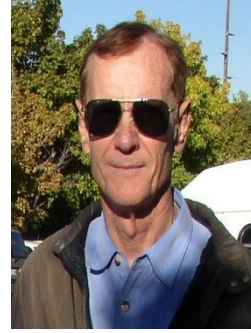


Editor's Message;
