From the Top Down By: Roger Heath

Spring is finally here but as is typical with Spring in Utah it can be in the 60's one day and snowing the next as is evident on the first day of Spring. However, as inconsistent as the weather is, Spring always brings out the optimism of warmer weather and shedding cabin fever for some of us. It also means driving weather is just about here.

One of things the Board has been working on the last month or so is a club email account. The intent is to better enable communication not only from the Board to you, but from you to the Board. Each Board member will have access to the account and able to see all incoming emails. If a reply is required, the Board member best capable of answering the email will reply directly back to you. You can use the email to send comments, questions, ideas, complaints, or whatever to the board. One example, if someone wants to plan an impromptu drive, the drive is usually posted on Facebook. The post may or may not be seen by everyone. Now, in addition to the Facebook post, you can send an email to the Board and one of us can shotgun the drive info out to everyone through email. Adding this email account did result in some added responsibilities to the club by-laws that apply to the Board members. Voting on this addition will take place at the April 2nd monthly club meeting. The email address is utahmiataclub@yahoo.com. Though the email will not be officially active until after April 2nd please feel free to test it now so if there are kinks we can have those worked out. Also, it will be imperative to notify Jim Newson of any changes to your current email address.

The proposed addition to the Bylaws we will be voting on is:

"The Executive Board shall maintain a club email for occasional communications with club members. The Executive Board and applicable Appointed Positions shall follow the expectations and duties as outlined in "Exhibit A, Utah Miata Club Email Address Expectations and Duties"."

PayPal: there have been thoughts of doing away with PayPal and the ability to join or renew your membership and pay online. Recently a member paid using PayPal and noticed the name and email on his receipt was for someone who has long been gone as the treasurer and has actually moved out of state. After over an hour plus on the phone, Margie was finally able to get the account straightened out. She wants to continue allowing online paying so for now the PayPal account will remain. Those that are paying online will need to adjust the amount they pay by \$2. Those paying via PayPal for a single membership will need to pay \$27. For a member plus one it's \$37. The extra \$2 is to account for the fees imposed by PayPal. For those paying by check or cash it's still the low rate of \$25 and \$35.

Miata Tales By: Ken Jaworski

It looks like spring is just around the corner.....MAYBE?

Well, there are a few of us with our MIATA's still under wraps, just waiting for the sun to shine and the snow to disappear. If by chance you are one, like me, WHYGROWUP is still under her blankets staying warm and comfy. Did you remember to remove the battery and keep it charged up? If not, shame on you. Just a little trickle of electricity will help it jump back to life. Here's how my battery looks today.

What do ya know....it looks just like a battery! Last month, the info we received from Val and Doyle that if the battery does not provide power to the Miata's computer you might or might not have to reboot back to the real world. Obviously, with my battery on it's recharging stand, I will have to reboot its computer, but WHYGROWUP is an older Special Edition 2001 and the reboot procedure is a lot simpler. Just replace the battery and start the engine. I worry more about the lack of lubrication on the cylinders than the battery and computer at this point. It's amazing how just a little 1- or 2-amp trickle charger can maintain a battery.



Now if you did not trickle charge your Miata's battery during the cold spell called winter, you just might have to use a little more force to get it up to operational standards. This normally requires more amps into the battery in a shorter time. This

is where a full-size charger is worth its weight in gold. Mine is just a 10-amp charger with a 2-amp maintainer and a 55-amp jump starter when needed.

If you have to jump start your Miata, please connect the POSITIVE battery post first, then connect the NEGATIVE to a good ground, not necessarily the NEGATIVE battery post. Connecting to the NEGATIVE post might cause a spark and explode the sulfating

vapor of the bad battery. You should also connect the discharge battery before connecting to the jumping battery. After you have a good connection start running the charging car's engine at a moderate speed just above idle for a few minutes before trying to start the problem vehicle. Remember when disconnecting the batteries use the reverse action by disconnecting the NEGATIVE first then the POSITIVE. Again, we are just trying to prevent any spark near flammable/explosive vapors.

Please see Roger's article below on an optional way of helping start Miata's that have a dead battery. It sure beats jumper cables and sparks and procedures, etc.

BTW using the procedures above for winter storage, my first battery lasted 19 years before it finally went kaput.

Remember to check your tire pressure because AIR is what you are really driving on.



Battery Jump Box By: Roger Heath

How many times have you gone out to start your car and the battery is dead? It worked just fine the day before but now you're in a parking lot somewhere and it's dead. Unfortunately you're alone, you have no jumper cables or, if you do, there's no one to give you a jump. And, with summer driving season coming up we do a lot of drives out in the boonies and the thought of being in the middle of nowhere with a dead battery is not a fun thought.

So I looked into small lithium battery jumpers and read numerous reviews. Almost all reviews I read the brand NOCO, and specifically model GB40, stood out as one of the favorites. There are also other brands just as worthy. What's nice about this type of jumper is they are small (remember small trunk), they will jump a dead battery numerous times before they need to be recharged, and best of all, another vehicle is not needed to help with the jump. Oh, they will also recharge your phone.

Following last month's article on the Airmoto tire inflator, this could be another handy item to keep in your trunk.





Another Update: New Hotel Option for Grand Canyon Tour June 24th – 29th

Last month, we told you about an option for those going to the South Rim; instead of staying at a South Rim hotel, a couple of cars are traveling on to Williams then taking the train into the Grand Canyon. If interested in this option, see the information further below.

Now there is another new option for both those going only to the North Rim and those going to the South Rim:


The original plan has been to stay two nights in Kanab, then the North Rim folks going home while the South Rim group heads to the South Rim. Instead of staying two nights in Kanab, some are now staying the second night in Page AZ. This way there won't be as much back tracking after visiting the Marble Canyon / Vermillion Cliffs area and Navajo Bridge. Sunday home will be across northern Highway 89 and follow it as desired north back to SLC. Map of Day 2 is shown here that ends in Page. For those going on to the South Rim, this puts you closer to your destination than driving from Kanab.

Here is the hotel information if you are interested in changing the second night from Kanab to Page (and remember to cancel night 2 in Kanab):

Saturday night, June 25th: Best Western View of Lake Powell Hotel, 716 Rimview Drive, Page Arizona, 928-645-8868.

For the South Rim half of our Grand Canyon road trip, there are four couples (Nicholl, Klinshaw, Porter, and Mechling) who will be going to Williams, Az. for two nights (Jun 26th & 27th) and the train ride to and from the Grand Canyon.





The name of the package they have signed up for is the "Two Night Railway Getaway Package". This package gets you two nights, two dinners, two breakfasts, and a coach train ride to and from the Grand Canyon. Other packages are also available. **The website** is www.thetrain.com. We booked our reservations on the phone at 1-800-843-8724 (1-800-THE-TRAIN). Please ask any of us if you have any guestions.

Here is the original information we have been posting in case this new option has persuaded anyone else to join this trip:

Plan is to leave Friday, June 24th and spend 2 nights in Kanab (or one night Kanab and one night Page). Recommended hotels in Kanab are the Best Western Red Hills or Comfort Suites. However you're free to stay wherever you want. The first part of the trip will be to the North Rim, spending part of the day in the park and for those that want head east along the Vermilion Cliffs to the Navajo Bridge spanning Marble Canyon.

For those that want to spend a couple of extra nights we'll head to the South Rim on Sunday, June 26th, spending 2 nights inside the park. If you intend to do this part lodging is filling up quickly so I suggest you reserve your rooms as soon as possible.

Stay Hydrated By Roger Heath

You may not be aware but Yeti Drinkware allows you to customize almost all of their drinkware from bottles, tumblers, mugs, etc. with a logo. I've had tumblers customized with the Utah Miata Club logo. Normally the cost for a custom logo is the price of the Yeti drinkware + \$6 design fee + \$10 setup fee per design. Yeti allows for a 20% military discount on the drinkware itself. This discount will pay for most or all of the \$6 design fee depending on the cost of the item being ordered. The Board has decided to do two orders per year for those interested and the club will pay for the \$10 setup fee. The cost of the item ordered will be on the member. If there's interest the first order will be taken at the annual picnic.


I was invited to be represented in the spotlight article and I was happy to do so. As some of you may already know, I am currently the

I am now working for Uber Eats and I'm semiretired.





New on the calendar is a trip to Great Basin National Park over Labor Day Weekend, September 3rd, 4th, and 5th.


This will be a short 2 night trip over Labor Day weekend to Great Basin National Park in eastern Nevada.

Sunday, Sept 4th - travel into the park and hopefully take a tour of Lehman Cave


Monday, Sept 5th - head back home, either backtrack the same route home or head north to Wendover and I-80
